What are OER?

"Open Educational Resources (OER) are teaching, learning and research materials in any medium – digital or otherwise – that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits nocost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions. OER form part of 'Open Solutions', alongside Free and Open Source software (FOSS), Open Access (OA), Open Data (OD) and crowdsourcing platforms." (UNESCO)

What are the advantages of OER?

- Quality of resources increases
- Open Educational Resources
- Visibility of your own work increases
- Quality of learning and teaching increases
- Reputation as a technical expert increases
- Saves Time in the preparation of the course materials

For whom are OER interesting?

For teachers, OER are enriching and free materials that can improve the quality of their teaching. For students, OER are helpful materials to deepen educational content.


